Conflict of Interest (COI) Disclosures

Information as of December 15, 2017

To ensure that deliberations of the Scientific Registry of Transplant Recipients (SRTR) Visiting Committee (SVC) and any subcommittees do not constitute a conflict of interest (COI) for its members, the SRTR collects COI disclosures from voting and ex-officio members.

Disclosed information suggesting that an individual may have a potential conflict of interest regarding one or more aspects of his/her work for the SRTR will be evaluated to determine whether action is needed to manage, reduce, or eliminate the conflict. Actions taken may include exclusion of an individual from specific activities, projects, discussions, or votes; in some instances, a conflict may preclude an individual from working with the SRTR in any capacity.

Time frame: Past 3 years or reasonably expected in next 12 months.

Please list any SRTR-relevant entity (e.g., business, association, society, group, etc.) in which you, your spouse or domestic partner, or any dependent child of yours has an ownership interest or other financial interest more than 5% of the entity's equity. E.g., stocks/stock options. You need not disclose interests in mutual funds, pensions, or other institutional investment funds whose investment policies are beyond your control. Time frame: Any time in the past 3 years or reasonably expected in next 12 months.
3. Please describe any SRTR-relevant consulting arrangement or other agreement to provide services for which you, your spouse or domestic partner, or any dependent child of yours has received in any of the past 3 years or reasonably expect to receive during the next 12 months.
4. Please describe any SRTR-relevant arrangement under which you, your spouse or domestic partner, or any dependent child of yours has received in personal payments, loans, or services (other than consulting fees). Time frame: Past 3 years or reasonably expected in next 12 months.
